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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This Draft Common Land Statement has been prepared on behalf of National Grid Electricity Distribution (NGED) by WSP UK Ltd (WSP). The purpose of the statement is to support a secondary consent under Section 38 of the Commons Act 2006 for works associated with a wider DNS application to be submitted to Planning and Environment Decisions Wales (PEDW) for the installation of a 66 kV overhead line and underground cable connection which will provide a connection between the Upper Ogmere Wind Farm, situated within Bridgend County Borough Council.

This statement has been prepared to provide a background and overview of the application, and to demonstrate the suitability of the proposed works to be undertaken on the common land. The statement explores the relevant legislation and guidance available, and also details the consultation that has been completed to date.

In summary the proposed works involved laying cables between the edge of the registered common and an area of land recently de-registered under DNS-3213662 for the Upper Ogmere Wind Farm. The area of common land that would be affected by the proposed construction works would be 50m long (approximately) by 5 metres wide, totalling a maximum of approximately 250m².

Overall, it is considered that the works proposed on the common land are minimal, temporary in nature and acceptable.

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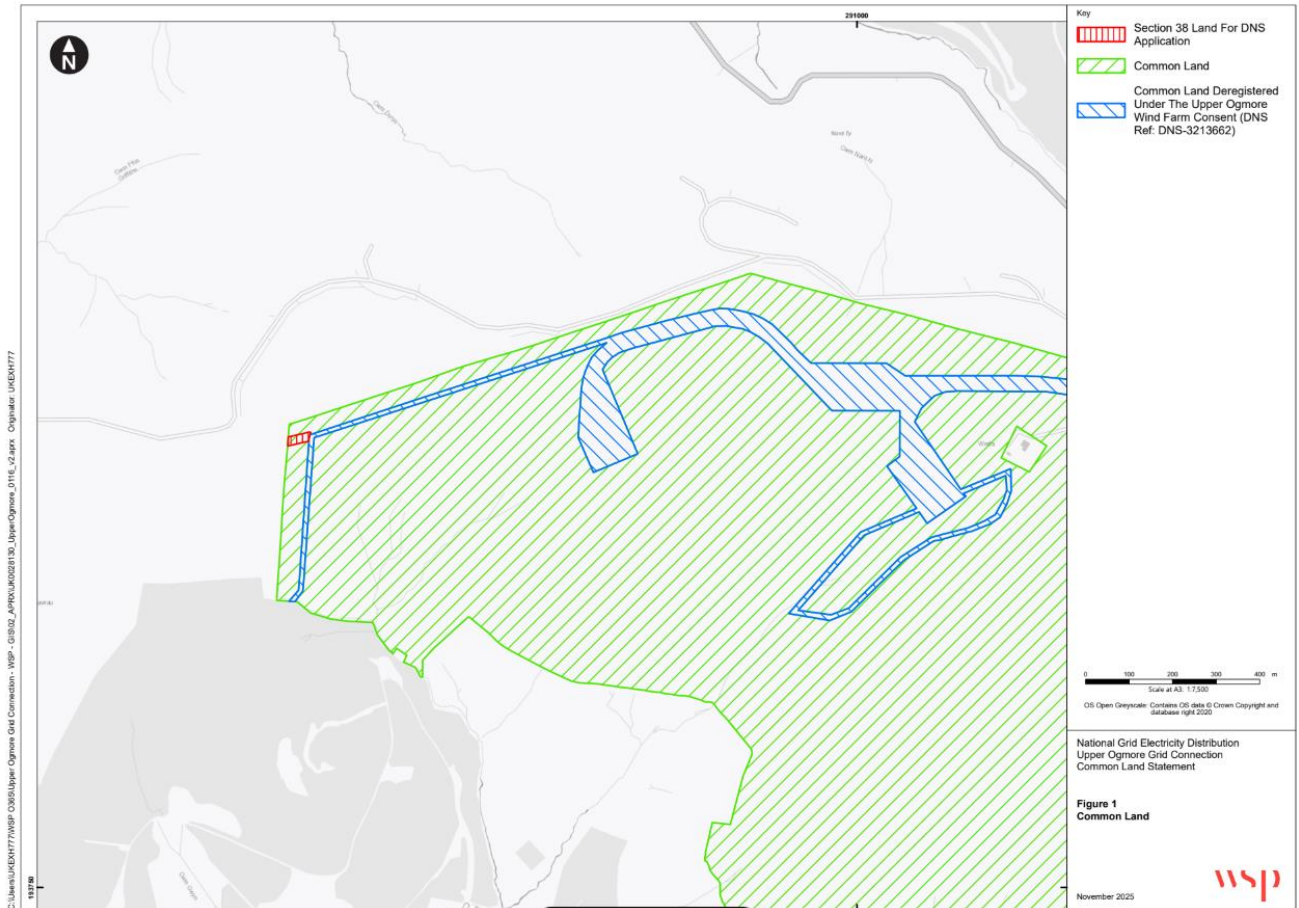
1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 OVERVIEW

- 1.1.1. This Draft Common Land Statement has been prepared on behalf of National Grid Electricity Distribution (NGED) (the Applicant) by WSP Ltd (WSP) to support a submission to Planning and Environment Decisions Wales (PEDW) acting on behalf of the Welsh Government, for consent as a Development of National Significance (DNS).
- 1.1.2. The Project directly connects to the consented Upper Ogmore Wind Farm's (DNS Application reference: DNS/3213662) on-site electricity infrastructure. It comprises both 66 kilovolts (kV) overhead lines (OHL) and underground cables (UGC), which will provide the connection between the National Grid and the Upper Ogmore Wind Farm.
- 1.1.3. As part of the Project, the Applicant requires temporary works to be undertaken on the common land, Mynydd Llangeinor Common (CL26). In total a small amount of common land will be used to accommodate UGC, which will then connect to a pre-existing corridor of de-registered common land that was previously de-registered within the application for the Upper Ogmore Wind Farm, approved in September 2022 (02959-1103009 ref for Common Land report)¹.
- 1.1.4. Overall, the area of common land that would be affected by the proposed construction works would be 50m in length by 5 metres in width, totalling a maximum of approximately 250m². The relevant area of common land is shown in **Figure 1** of this report.
- 1.1.5. As a result of the proposed scheme of works as outlined in brief above (detailed further within Section 3), a secondary consent application is being made under Section 38 of the Common Act 2006 as part of the wider DNS application for the grid connection.

1.2 PURPOSE OF THE STATEMENT

- 1.2.1. This draft statement has been prepared to support the secondary consent application that will be submitted under Section 38 of the Commons Act 2006 (the Act), to allow the Applicant to undertake work on the common, to implement the underground cables proposed as part of the proposed grid connection (the Project).
- 1.2.2. The purpose of this draft statement relates to section 39(1) of the Act, which sets out the criteria to which the Welsh Ministers must have regard when assessing applications made under Section 38. These are:
- *The interests of the persons having rights in relation to, or occupying the land (and in particular, persons exercising rights of common over it).*
 - *The interest of the neighbourhood.*
 - *The public interest.*
 - *Any other matter considered to be relevant.*
- 1.2.3. Section 39(4) goes on to states that:

In considering the effect in relation to any land of proposed works under this section, the appropriate national authority may consider that effect in conjunction with the effect in relation to that land of any other works for which consent has previously been given under section 38(1) above or section 194 of the Law of Property Act 1925 (c. 20).

- The potential disturbance during the construction period and any measures required to mitigate this.

2 LEGAL FRAMEWORK AND POLICY GUIDANCE

2.1 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1.1. This section of the draft statement aims to provide an overview of the relevant policy and guidance associated with Section 38 of the Commons Act (2006), which is required to allow for ‘restricted work’ (which is not subject to common land being de-registered) to take place.

2.2 DNS CONSENT

- 2.2.1. The wider Project, the proposed Grid Connection, is a Development of National Significance (DNS). The Project is considered a DNS according to the Planning (Wales) Act 2015², the Development of National Significance (Wales) (Regulations) 2016 (as amended)³, and the Town and Country Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) (Wales) Regulations 2017 (as amended)⁴.
- 2.2.2. The requirement for a DNS application for both the OHL and UGC elements is triggered by the OHL section of the Project, referencing the England and Wales High Court (Administrative Court) Decisions (2019)⁵. The Project is considered to be relevant to the following factors:
- “iii. Functional interdependence - where one part of a development could not function without another, this may indicate that they constitute a single project (Burridge at [32], [42] and [78]).”*
- 2.2.3. The Project does not fall under the development types set out within Schedule 1 of the EIA regulations. However, the Project is described within Schedule 2 of the EIA Regulations; specifically, Schedule 2 (3)(k): the transmission of electrical energy by overhead cables.
- 2.2.4. This is further confirmed within the recent DNS Procedural Guidance (2025)⁶ which describes “*the installation of an electric line above ground up to 132kV which is associated with a devolved generation station*” as a DNS according to the regulations set out above.
- 2.2.5. The Project is therefore considered to be functionally interdependent with the consented Upper Ogmor Wind Farm, in that the wind farm will not be able to properly function without the proposed grid connection.

2.3 SECTION 38 COMMONS ACT 2006

- 2.3.1. Under paragraphs 12 and 13 of Schedule I of the Development of National Significance (Wales) (Regulations) 2016 (as amended), applications made under Section 38 of the Commons Act 2006 can be secondary consents for the DNS regime, so that the Welsh Ministers may consider them as part of the wider DNS application.
- 2.3.2. As per the above, NGED is applying for the consent for works to take place on the common, under Section 38 of the Common Act 2006.
- 2.3.3. Consent under Section 38 is required for the application to carry out ‘restricted work’ on the common land. As defined within section 38(2) and (3) of the Act, restricted works are defined as:
Works which have the effect of preventing or impeding access to or over, or involve the resurfacing of common land.
- 2.3.4. Where applications under Section 38 of the Act are sought as secondary consents under the DNS regime, as is the case for this Project, the procedure for the making and the determination of such applications is amended to align with the DNS application process.

2.4 WELSH GOVERNMENT GUIDANCE

- 2.4.1. Guidance on Section 38 of the Commons Act 2006 was published by the Welsh Government in 2014⁷, which has also been utilised to create this draft statement.

COMMON LAND CONSENTS GUIDANCE (2014)

- 2.4.2. The Common Land Consents Guidance provides insight into how common land applications will be assessed and determined. It is stated that the guidance should be read in conjunction with the 2006 Act and any other legislation of relevance.
- 2.4.3. Section 3.9 of the guidance goes into further detail, relating to the key considerations that must be taken into account by the Applicant when providing the common land statement, this includes ‘*the interest of persons having rights in relation to, or occupying the land, the interest of the neighbourhood, the public interest, and any other matter considered to be relevant*’.

NOTES FOR COMPLETING AN APPLICATION FORM FOR CONSENT TO CONSTRUCT WORKS ON COMMON LAND (2025)

- 2.4.4. In addition, the “Notes for completing an application form for consent to construct works on common land (2025)”⁸ were reviewed and adhered to when compiling the application forms.

3 THE PROJECT

3.1 BACKGROUND

- 3.1.1. The proposed Project is associated with the Upper Ogmores Wind Farm (DNS-3213662) and will provide a connection between the approved wind farm and the wider national grid. Without the Project, the wind farm would not be able to serve its purpose in providing renewable energy.
- 3.1.2. The requirement for renewable energy is accepted at the national policy level, with wind energy widely recognised as the most mature renewable energy technology currently available, as reflected in the approval of the Upper Ogmores Wind Farm.

3.2 OVERVIEW OF THE PROJECT

DESCRIPTION OF DEVELOPMENT

- 3.2.1. The connection will consist of approximately 4.9 km of underground cabling (UGC) and approximately 4.1 km of overhead lines. The Route will begin in the west, at an intersection with the Foel Trawnant Grid Connection (DNS reference: DNS CAS-02505-N3T6M4) to the west of the A4063 near Caerau, at a tee-off point connecting the grid connection to the wider national grid (NG Ref: SS 84115 93652). The Route begins as an Overhead Line (OHL), traversing approximately 1.1km (referred to as the Western OHL section). Upon reaching Caerau, the route then transitions into Underground Cables (UGC) (referred to as the Western UGC section), following the existing highway network (A4063) for approximately 1.7km to the north (NG Ref: SS 87032 94984). Immediately before reaching Brynheulog Road, the route goes back to OHL (referred to as the Eastern OHL Section) for approximately 3 km. **A small part of the Project will traverse through the common of Mynydd Llangeinor, a designated common land unit 26 (CL26).** To the northwest of Blaengarw, close to Mynydd Caerau, the route transitions back into UGC (referred to as the eastern UGC section) and continues west for approximately 3.2km. The connection will finish at the previously consented Upper Ogmores Wind Farm (NG Ref: SS 92011 95059).
- 3.2.2. The main elements of the Project consist of the following:
- 4.1 km of overhead lines, including 104 wooden poles (placed side by side to form the proposed H-Pole technology to support the overhead line – resulting in 52 H-Poles in total)
 - 4.9 km of underground cable, including cable ducts and 18 joint bay boxes;
 - Temporary working areas, e.g. construction compound; and
 - Watercourse crossing(s).

SITE AND SURROUNDINGS

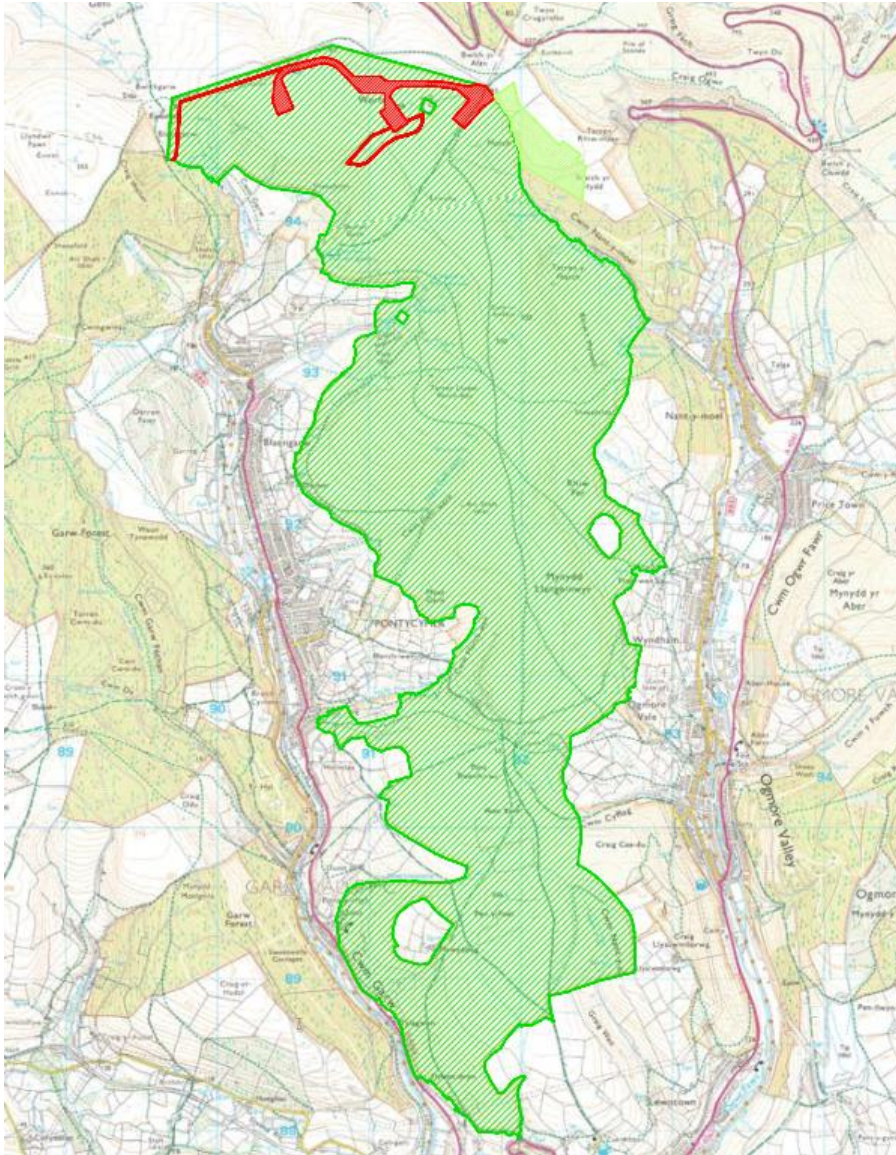
- 3.2.3. In terms of the site and surrounding area, the area of common that is the subject of the Section 38 application is upland acidic grassland and upland rush pasture.

4 THE COMMON

4.1 DESCRIPTION OF THE COMMON

- 4.1.1. The entire common totals an area of 1,032.352 ha; the common previously totalled an area of 1,049.162 ha; however, as stated previously, an application was made to de-register 16.81 ha of the common to allow for the successful consent of Upper Ogmores Wind Farm.

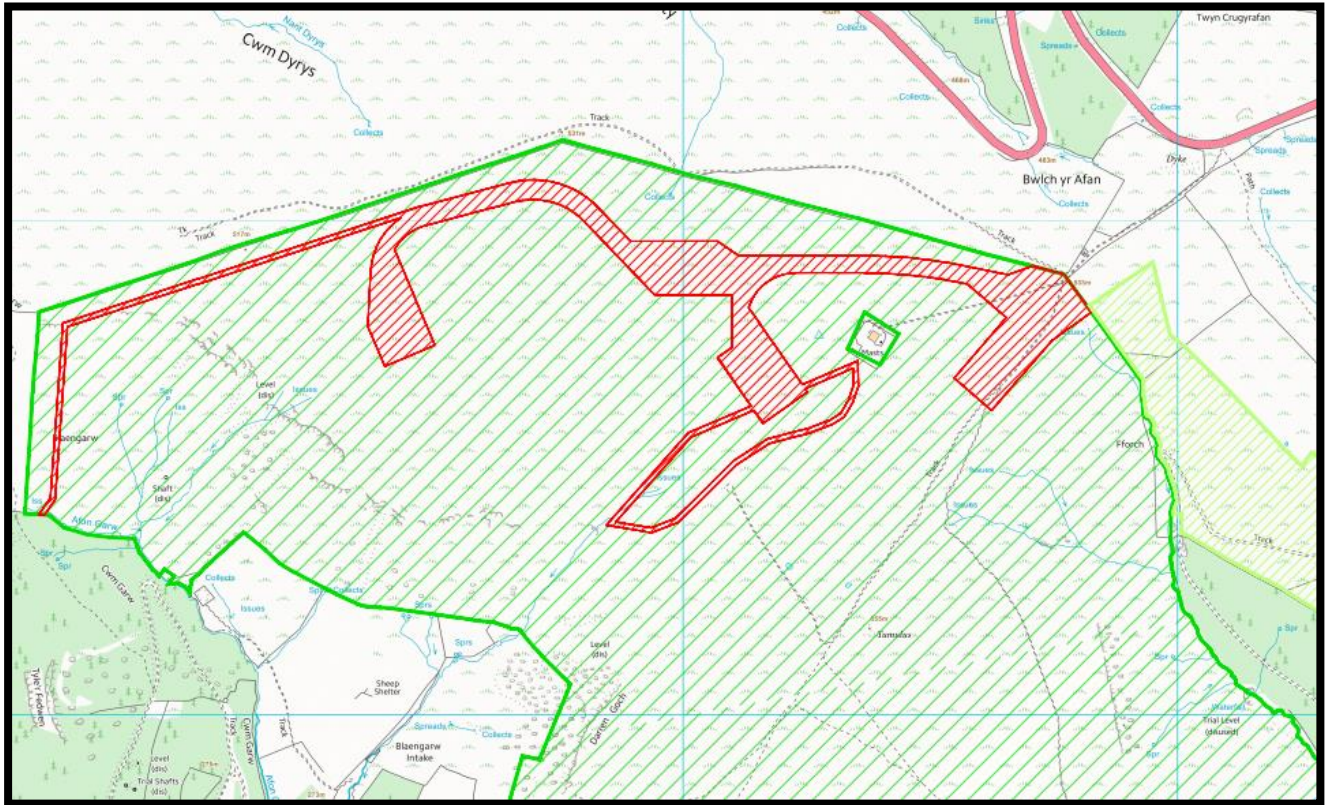
Figure 2: Plan showing the entire Mynydd Llangeinor Common and previously de-registered land under the Upper Ogmore Wind Farm consent.

- 4.1.2. The common is on land which forms a plateau between the Garw Valley and Ogmores Vale, with the villages of Pontycymmer and Blaengarw to the west, Ogmores and Nantymoel to the East, with Llangeinor and Blackmill to the south. Bounding the site are various settlements, farms and smallholdings on the steep inclines to the generally level common. **Figure 2** details the common as a whole (shown in green). The area shaded in red is related to the de-registered common land under the Upper Ogmores Wind Farm consent

4.2 PROPOSED WORK UNDER SECTION 38

- 4.2.1. The proposed area of common land to which Section 38 refers is 50m in length by 5 metres wide, totalling a maximum of approximately 250m². It is situated to the northwest of the wider Mynydd Llangeinor Common, approximately centred at NGR: SS 89464 94688.
- 4.2.2. The area of land which is subject to the application is situated on a relatively flat area of the common; the land to the east begins to plateau, and then dips considerably downhill to the south. Also, to the east of the area is the section of the common which is now de-registered, associated with Upper Ogmore Wind Farm. There is a pre-existing road/ track associated with the Upper Ogmore Windfarm to the north. **Figure 3** shows the land de-registered as part of the Upper Ogmore Wind Farm application.

- 4.2.3. The common has historically been used as an area used by sheep for grazing; the fauna present on the common primarily comprises moorland and dry upland heath grass species.
- 4.2.4. It is intended that the proposed UGC route will traverse through the small section (50m) of common land entering from the west, before then connecting into the previously de-registered land.
- 4.2.5. **Figure 3** details the previously de-registered section of land in context with the area subject to this application, and the proposed grid connection route of the Project.
- 4.2.6. Overall, use of the common land will be limited to avoid disturbing the land unnecessarily. The works proposed to take place on the common land will be for the implementation of UGC, through the use of trenches.

CABLE TRENCHES

- 4.2.7. Underground cabling work will involve placing cables within ducts; the ducts themselves will be within a trench. An open-cut method will be used, where the duct is laid directly into a trench of up to 1.5 m depth (**see Appendix 4C of the Environmental Statement**). The ducts are placed at the bottom of the trench, and the excavation around the duct is then filled with stone dust before the remaining excavation is backfilled with the excavated material. Cables are jointed at approximately 250 m intervals. The joint bays are generally 1 - 2 m deep and 5 m x 3 m for the cable proposed on the scheme. Once the cable ducts are laid, the cable will then be pulled through.
- 4.2.8. The creation of trenches, laying of cable ducts and pulling of cable will be in accordance with NGED (2021) Standard Technique: CA6A/73.



FENCING

- 4.2.9. Temporary fencing will be utilised during the construction of the works. Post and stock-proof fencing is likely to be utilised, and in keeping with fencing already present on the common. However, this will be confirmed closer to the time of submission.

ACCESS

- 4.2.10. Access will be achieved via existing tracks across the top of the mountain and existing gateways.

5 CONSULTATION AND CONSIDERATIONS

- 5.1.1. To support the secondary consent application, we have consulted with the commoners and users of the common to understand the use of the common.

5.2 CONSULTATION

- 5.2.1. National Grid, through its consultation partner Grasshopper, has engaged with commoners and users of the common to highlight the Project.
- 5.2.2. Identified commoners were sent notification of changes to the scheme on 4 November 2025 to inform them that the scheme would be progressing with the project crossing the Common of Mynydd Llangeinor. This was sourced from the Commons Register (appended to the draft application forms). The letter informed commoners of the changes to the scheme and stated that the project team would be in touch at the start of the official consultation period.
- 5.2.3. The consultation period was launched on 12 November 2025, with all listed commoners receiving a letter, newsletter, and a copy of a Schedule 1 statutory notice. Further details of the identified commoners are contained within the Consultation Report.

SURVEYS

- 5.2.4. The route of the proposed underground cable, including the section through the common, has been surveyed, and there are no protected or significant habitats that will be affected by the proposal

LANDOWNERS

- 5.2.5. The landowner is His Majesty the King in right of his Duchy of Lancaster. National Grid are in direct engagement with the duchy regarding the proposals. As a result, the landowner is aware of the proposals and, at the time of writing this draft statement, they support the proposals.

LAND OCCUPIERS

- 5.2.6. There are no formal tenancy occupiers. Instead, only commoners have rights to the area affected by this proposed Section 38 application.

PUBLIC ACCESS

- 5.2.7. For the area of the common that is subject to this Section 38 application, there are no public rights of way that will be affected by the proposals.

5.3 COMMON LAND CONSIDERATIONS

- 5.3.1. If consented, an area of approximately 250sq metres would be fence off to enable the cables to be laid. This would be a temporary measure. Once construction is complete, the Applicant will back fill the construction trenches and will return the habitat to its former condition. As a result, access to the land will be exactly as it was before construction took place

6 CONCLUSIONS

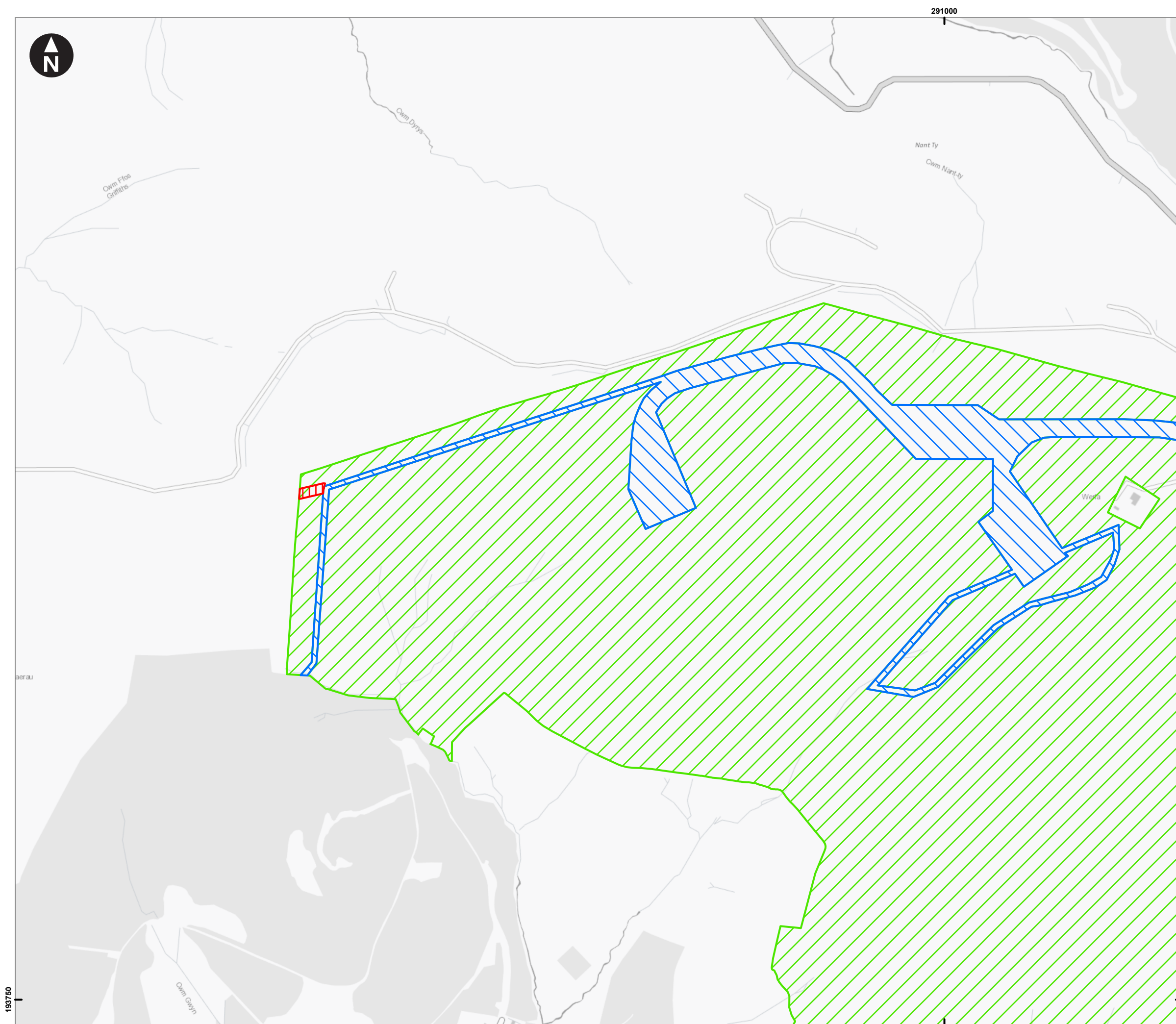
- 6.1.1. This application seeks secondary consent to a main DNS application for a grid connection, connecting the previously consented Upper Ogmores Wind Farm to the wider national grid, under Section 38 of the Commons Act 2006. The secondary consent seeks the temporary use of just 250m² of Mynydd Llangeinor Common for the implementation of UGCs.
- 6.1.2. This draft statement assesses the common land and the appropriateness of the proposed work.
- 6.1.3. To conclude, during construction, the area of common land affected will need to be fenced off. The erection of the fencing proposed under the section 38 application will be temporary. Otherwise, the land will be unobstructed and free to use by commoners and the public.
- 6.1.4. Once construction is complete, the common will be returned to its former condition. As a result, access to the land will be exactly as it was before construction took place for both commoners and the wider public.
- 6.1.5. For these reasons, it is considered that the Section 38 consent should be granted.






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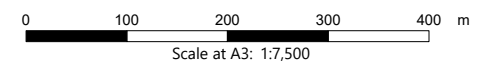

-  Common Land Deregistered Under The Upper Ogmore Wind Farm Consent (DNS Ref: DNS-3213662)

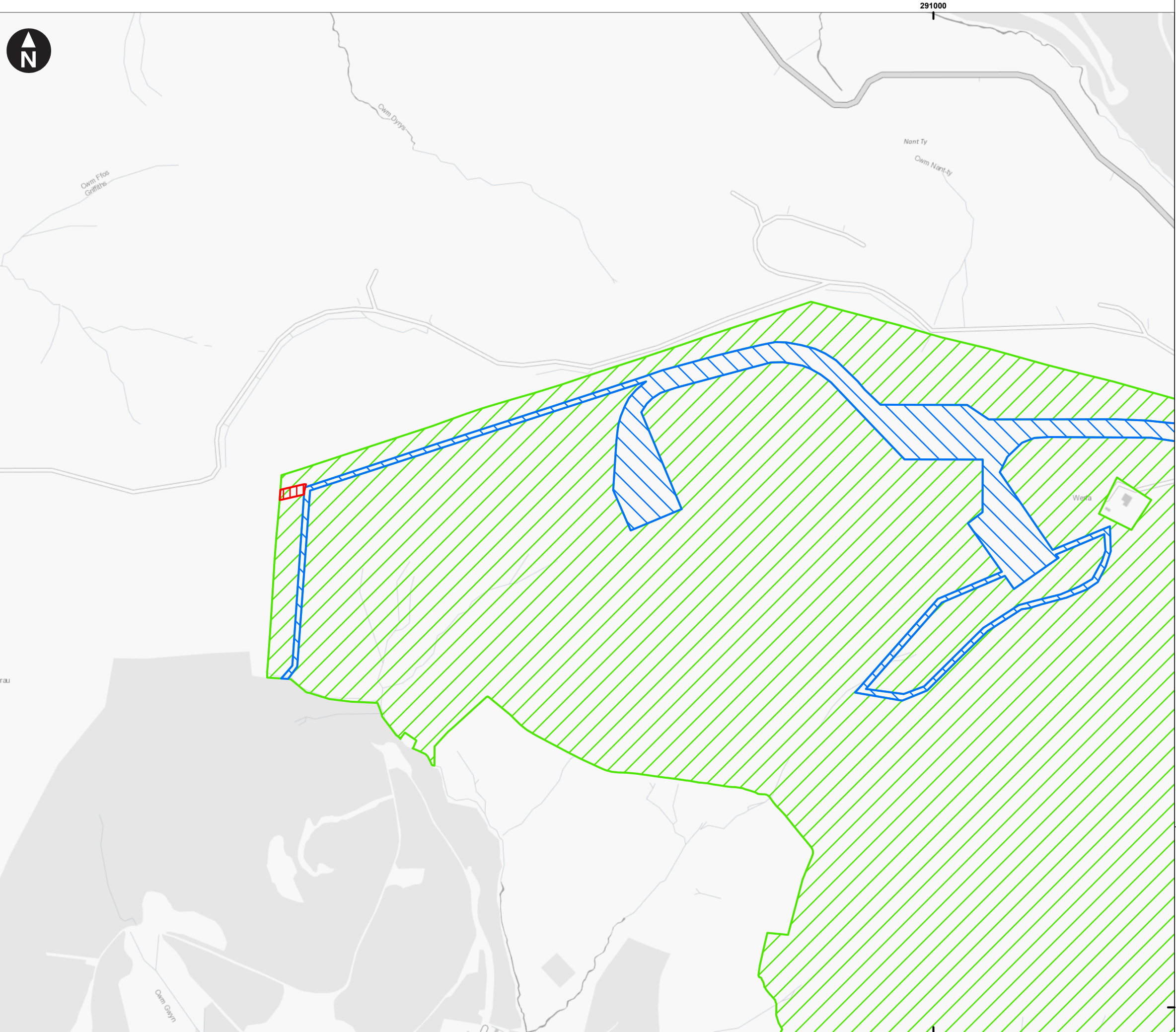

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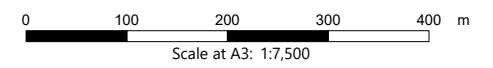
